# 2014 Bass Tournament Summary

2014 was another good year for Mississippi's bass tournament anglers based on 217 tournament reports. Average statistics for all lakes in 2014 were very similar to those in 2013 and still above the previous eight years of reporting. Average lunker weight, and numbers and pounds of bass caught per day were higher than 2013 values. At least five reports were received from eight lakes that are included in the "Final Rankings." Anglers are raving about the quality of the fishing at Bay Springs Lake; Pickwick Lake is still cranking out high numbers of bass over seven pounds; and the coastal rivers continue to provide the best numbers of bass per day. The following summarizes the most important points from the 2014 Tournament Report:

- 217 reports were submitted from 25 different lakes
- Bay Springs Lake finished as the top lake in overall quality indicator rankings
  followed by Pickwick Lake, Ross Barnett Reservoir, and the Pearl River.
- 39 bass over seven pounds were weighed-in; the largest bass was 10.63 pounds from Pickwick Lake.




• A total of 217 tournaments reported 10,145 anglers that weighed-in 18,036 bass (Table 1). The number of tournament reports increased in 2014 (Figure 1). The most reports came from Pickwick Lake.




- It took an average of 14.62 pounds to win a tournament in 2014 (Table 1). Of lakes with a least five tournaments reported, Bay Springs, Pickwick and Ross Barnett had the highest average winning weights.
- Average weight of bass ranged from 1.35 pounds at Jourdan River to 3.23 pounds at Ohkissa Lake (Table 1). The statewide average weight was 2.39 pounds. Using average length of tournaments to define an angler day, the number of bass caught per angler day was highest on Back Bay Biloxi and pounds caught per angler day was highest at Pickwick Lake.
- The seasonal distribution of 2014 tournaments appears in Figure 2. February through June was the most popular months to conduct tournaments with over 20 per month reported. Tournament reports were submitted from all 12 months.

• Both pounds per day (4.35) and average weight of bass weighed-in (2.16) were slightly higher than 2013 values. The hours to weigh-in a five pound bass increased to 374 (Figure 3).



• Three of the top-10 heaviest 5-bass limits came from Pickwick Lake in 2014, with one of the limits surpassing 30 pounds (Table 2). Bay Springs, Lake Bogue Homa, and Ross Barnett Reservoir each had two sacks in the top-10 heaviest 5-bass limits. The remaining big sack was caught at Lake Lincoln State Park. The largest sack was weighed-in at Pickwick by American Bass Anglers during August. The second biggest sack was caught at Bay Springs in May by Fishers of Men. Four of the 10 big sacks were weighed-in during March.

- The number of bass weighed-in over five pounds slightly decreased in 2014. On average, it took 374 angler hours to weigh-in a bass over five pounds. There were 222 bass five pounds or larger (1.2% of the total number) weighed-in in 2014.
- In 2014 there were 39 lunkers that weighed at least seven pounds, and one lunker caught at Pickwick was over 10 pounds (Table 3). As in 2013, sixty-seven percent of the big bass came from either Pickwick or Ross Barnett. Pickwick alone had 51% of the lunkers over seven pounds.
- Twenty-two clubs or tournament organizations submitted 217 reports (Table 4). Seventeen clubs submitted five or more reports and ten clubs submitted 10 or more. The average number of reports received per club or organization was ten.

 Team tournaments were only slightly more popular than individual tournaments with 52% of the reports submitted from team events. These tournaments averaged 27 teams per tournament. Individual tournaments accounted for 48% of the reports and averaged 43 participants per event. Limits of bass were weighed-in by 42% of all anglers or teams during 2014.

- Lakes with at least five tournament reports were ranked by averaging seven "quality indicators" (Table 5). The top five lakes in 2014 were Bay Springs, Pickwick, Ross Barnett, Pearl River and Gulfport Lake. Bay Springs received the highest ranks for three of the seven quality indicators and Pickwick Lake received the highest ranks for two quality indicators. Bay Springs received high marks for winning weight, hours to catch a bass over five pounds, and percentage of limits weighed-in. Pickwick received high marks for average weight and pounds of bass weighed-in per day. Ross Barnett scored high for the percentage of limits weighed-in and hours to catch a bass over 5 pounds. The Pearl River and Gulfport Lake both received high ranks for number and pounds weighed-in per day. Bay Springs replaced Pickwick as the top lake in 2014, with Pickwick a close second. Ross Barnett had a good year and moved up to third from fifth. The Pearl River remained in fourth and Gulfport Lake rounded out the top five. Natural fluctuations in bass abundance and size structure are normal, plus environmental conditions and angling pressure vary from year to year.
- Tournament bag limits varied from three to five bass and were more restrictive than state regulations. Most tournaments had a 12-inch minimum length limit.
- Success of this program depends on participation from clubs and tournament organizers. We thank all those who voluntarily submitted report cards. Higher numbers of reports allow better estimates of fishing conditions; not just a good or bad day's fishing by one or two clubs. Results can be used by tournament directors, anglers and biologists to better manage and enjoy our fisheries resources. Angler involvement has been and remains the key to protecting and managing Mississippi's fisheries resources.
