

December 10, 2024 Weekly Waterfowl Report

The following report is a compilation of public and private land reports and habitat assessments during the week ending December 8, 2024.

Jackson, MS – The second segment of the 2024-25 Mississippi duck season started over the past weekend and will stay in until January 31, 2025. Last week the temperatures remained relatively cold, with the highs in the mid 50s and lows dipping below freezing for a few days. Some areas began to see an increase in waterfowl use but overall numbers are still relatively low. Shallowly flooded wetland habitat availability is still limited and is likely one of the driving factors for the overall duck abundance in the state. A large portion of the state received some rain over the weekend, which should provide for a slight increase in habitat but wetland availability remains low for this time of year. Significant amounts of rainfall will be required to fill many of the state's low-lying areas. Many rivers are still well below flood stage and are projected to remain low for the coming weeks.

Reports from northern and mid-latitude states show that large numbers of gadwall, wood ducks, and teal are showing up as well as an increase in snow and white-fronted geese. As winter weather continues to blanket food resources in those states, waterfowl should continue to migrate further south. Some Wildlife Management Areas (WMAs) across the Delta are still holding ducks and having some hunting success. The harvest numbers for this week only reflect the Saturday hunt day and not an entire week of harvest due to the split in the season. Several WMAs are still slowly increasing in flooded habitat. Hunters are encouraged to keep an eye out for newly flooded wetland habitat after rain events like the one predicted for this week.

The December aerial waterfowl survey is planned for this week, and survey results will be posted on MDWFP's website and social media platforms.
