Your purchase of fishing equipment and motor boat fuels supports Sport Fish Restoration and boating access facilities. Mississippi Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks (MWFP) began a program in 1998 for bass tournament anglers to help biologists monitor bass populations along the Tenn-Tom Waterway. The number of reporting tournaments has increased each year and a statewide program was begun in 2002.

In some waters, it may be the <u>only</u> measure we have of what anglers are catching. Bass clubs and tournament organizers are encouraged to provide valuable tournament results to MWFP on the form shown below:

2003 Bass Tournament Program Results

A total of 219 tournaments reported 35,652 pounds of bass (Table 1). Report cards were received on 29 lakes. Bay Springs Lake had the most tournaments reported.

Average weight of bass ranged from 1.05 pounds in Gulfport Lake to 2.89 pounds in Lake Bogue Homa. The statewide average weight of tournament bass was 1.55 pounds. Using average length of tournaments to define an angler day, pounds caught/angler day were highest at Bay Springs Lake and Lock C (TTW).

It took an average of 12.26 pounds to win a tournament in 2003 (Table 1). Of lakes with a least five tournaments reported, Lake Ferguson and Ross Barnett Reservoir had the highest average winning weights.

Lakes (at least five tournaments reported) were ranked by averaging six "quality indicators" (Table 2). The top 3 lakes in 2003 were Bay Springs Lake, Lake Ferguson, and Ross Barnett Reservoir. Bay Springs replaced Pickwick this year and received high marks for number of bass and pounds of bass caught per day, as well as more bass over five pounds caught per day. Ferguson and Barnett scored well under average weight per bass and average winning weight. Columbus Lake and Lock D (Tenn-Tom Waterway) rounded out the top-5. This information is best used to follow trends on a particular lake. Natural fluctuations in bass abundance and size structure are normal, plus environmental conditions and angling pressure vary from year to year.

Thirty clubs or organizers submitted more than one report card (Table 3), compared to only 13 clubs or organizers in 2002. This represents over a 75% increase over reports received in 2002. More reports from any particular lake will increase the validity of the data for that lake.

Team tournaments made up 57% of the reports submitted and averaged 27 teams per tournament. Individual tournaments (e.g., club tournaments) accounted for 43% of the reports and averaged 40 participants per event.

On the average, it took 460 angler hours, or 54 angler days, to weigh-in a bass over five pounds during 2003 tournaments. A total of 184 bass five pounds or larger were reported.

Of these, fourteen were at least seven pounds (Table 4). More bass over five pounds were weighed-in at Bay Springs, Pickwick, and Ross Barnett. The largest bass reported weighed 8.93 pounds from Bay Springs Lake.

The heaviest five-bass limit weighed 23.69 pounds from Lake Ferguson. The heavy sack was weighed-in on April 12, 2003, during a Fishers of Men tournament.

Limits of bass were weighed-in by 31% of all anglers or team, similar to the number of limits reported in 2002.

Tournament bag limits varied from 5 to 7 bass and were more restrictive than state regulations. Most tournaments had a 12-inch minimum length limit.

Success of this program depends on more participation from clubs and tournament organizers with MWFP. We thank all those who voluntarily submitted report cards. Results can be used by tournament directors, anglers, and biologists to better manage and enjoy our fishery resources.

Angler involvement has been and remains the key to protecting and managing Mississippi's fishery resources.
